

Suggested layout. The actual layout may vary but the dimensions should remain the same (1ft x 1ft per nation)




A part of this project is to allow the children the freedom to paint what they want. As a general outline, here is a picture of what I am aiming for. This is a view of Canada from space and what I expect a child from Canada may paint. What I am looking for is for them to paint the Earth surrounded by space as opposed to a landscape as they see it at ground level. You should feel comfortable discussing this with the child before they begin but you shouldn't guide them into painting anything.




So, you may wish to lead them in this direction by showing them a globe or some pictures but the end choice should be their own. One important point is to <u>NOT</u> show them the other paintings until after they have finished their own painting (view following page).

Only the first name of the child and the name of the country should appear.



Here is what the canvas may look like halfway through the project and partially completed

\* I have used the same picture of the "Earth from Space" showing Canada to make things easier in this example but would assume that the real paintings will each look different \* Once you're finished with the painting and it's dry, you should cover up the section the child from your country has painted prior to shipping (you can cut a garbage bag, use paper, etc). If the canvas arrives with images showing, please cover them before the child from your country begins to paint. Only after they're done with their section should you reveal the other images!





- 1 First steps: Netherlands → East Timor (early May early June)
- European loop: Netherlands  $\rightarrow$  Spain  $\rightarrow$  Ireland  $\rightarrow$  Iceland  $\rightarrow$  Netherlands (mid-June early August)



Third Stage: Netherlands  $\rightarrow$  Indonesia (via pick-up in China at the IAU general assembly)  $\rightarrow$  India  $\rightarrow$  Morocco (Mid-August – end of September)



Last leg: Morocco → Nigeria → Tanzania → South Africa → Canada (beginning October – mid-December)
